

Non-Degree Graduate Coursework Information Guide

Facts to Be Aware Of Before Proceeding as a Non-Degree Student

- Transfer of non-degree credits to a MN or DNP Program of Study is restricted.
 Course work taken on a non-degree basis may transfer to a degree option if the
 student is admissible at the time they enrolled in nursing courses as a non-degree
 seeking student.
- Completion of courses as a non-degree seeking student does not in and of itself guarantee acceptance into the MN or DNP degree programs at a later date.
- Non-degree students are not eligible for financial assistance of any kind.

If You Decide to Proceed and Register as a Non-Degree Seeking Student

- Review course information for pre-requisites. Online catalog information is available at http://catalog.montana.edu/coursedescriptions/nrsg/.
- Course enrollment is based on 1) available space, 2) completion of course prerequisites, and 3) the instructor's written permission.
- Non-degree students who enroll in graduate nursing courses are expected to follow the same schedule as matriculated students (e.g. travel to Bozeman for orientation and face-to-face course meetings at the beginning of the fall semester) unless alternate arrangements have been made.
- Graduate nursing courses are anchored in Desire2Learn.
- Proficiency in computer skill and Internet access is required. See Technical Requirements at http://www.montana.edu/wwwnu/pdf/MN_Technical_Requirements.pdf.

Steps to Apply

• Submit an official non-degree graduate application to the Graduate School http://www.montana.edu/gradschool/admissions/apply.html.
