**Applications are being accepted from the general public for the following position:**

These are temporary, full-time positions. The GS level received will be determined by experience, educational credits in biological sciences, and position availability. Employees will begin work on May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2026, and end around late August or early September 2026. Interviews will begin on March 2<sup>nd</sup> and go through March 13<sup>th</sup>. **We will begin interviewing candidates as resumes are received, so we encourage you to apply as soon as possible.** After February 27<sup>th</sup>, please call the number above to inquire about potential vacancies.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Applicants must be 18 years of age by the time of employment and have a valid driver's license. Applicants must have a high school diploma or equivalent. Secondary course work and/or experience in the biological sciences is preferred but not required.

**DUTIES:** Duties may include placing and servicing insect traps, collecting insects with nets and by hand, visually surveying grasshoppers and other pests, and possible application of pesticides for grasshopper suppression activities. Maintaining and submitting accurate records is critical. Data will be gathered with handheld devices and on paper. **Most of the work will involve frequent extended overnight travel away from Billings/Helena. Work hours will be Monday – Thursday from 7:30 am to 6:00 pm.** While in official travel status, a government vehicle will be provided, hotel expenses will be paid by the employer, and meals will be reimbursed. Most of the duties require working independently, without direct supervision, often in rural areas.

**TO APPLY:** Please provide a resume (no more than two pages) that includes detailed tasks, responsibilities, and other experience. Describe years/months of previous positions. For example: hours per week (Aug 2023 – May 2024 roughly 20 hours per week). You may also submit an OF 612 (Optional Application for Federal Employment).
