Montana 4-H People Partner grants - due February 14

These grants provide incentives and financial support to groups and individuals for programs that enhance the quality of living for people in their communities.

Application Deadline: Postmarked by February 14 Each application is eligible for up to \$500.

Eligibility

4-H groups and individual members may apply. Grants are also open to non-4-H youth groups and individuals. Applications should meet the following criteria:

- Youth should be involved in determining, planning, conducting, and evaluating the project.
- Project will make it possible for people to accomplish something educational and worthwhile that helps them reach a higher quality of life.
- There is community support and acceptance of the project, as evidence by "partners" listed in the grant application, additional funding sources, and resource persons and agencies involved.
- The project has lasting benefits.

If a group, club, committee, etc. is interested in applying, please chat with Kari or Lisa now to begin planning. In recent years these projects have helped fund fleece tie blankets, herdsmanship banner in the Rabbit/Poultry barn, wash rack project, new show ring at Seewald barn, and more. Visit https://www.mt4hfoundation.org/grants.html for details and to see past award recipients. Projects do not have to be 4-H related, they can be for a community need that 4-Hers identify.

The committee agreed to partner with them financially and they'll be submitting a Montana 4-H Foundation People Partner grant application as well.

Camp Counselor Applications Open

4-H members who are 4-H ages 14 (as of October 1, 2024) and will be in grades 9—12 (for the 2024-25 school year), please consider applying to be a camp counselor. 4-H Camp will be June 25-27, 2025, at the Montana Farmer's Union Camp near Highwood. NEW this year, counselors will go down a day earlier (afternoon of June 24) to set up and get prepped. Counselors will help plan the camp, will lead workshops and games, and oversee the campers in their cabins.

Applicants need to submit a completed application by **February 7 via Zsuite** including a cover letter and resume. Selected counselors will need to attend two mandatory camp counselor workshops on March 2nd and April 13th and pay a \$25 fee to help offset meals and t-shirt expenses.

Please include relevant personal experiences of what you learned from your Marias Fair livestock results and how you used that knowledge to produce a quality product for the livestock industry.
- Livestock Committee Scholarship (multiple available) \$700 Must have exhibited livestock at the Marias Fair during a previous year as a 4-H project. Has displayed leadership skills within any 4-H livestock project. Please include the following information: Cover letter, One (1) letter of recommendation, Livestock exhibited by applicant at Marias Fair and year(s) exhibited. Leadership activities related to the applicant's 4-H livestock projects. Include dates and a brief description of leadership roles.
- Mary Jane Kinyon scholarship \$550 Must submit a one page essay on how 4-H has helped the applicant in their education.


