 - Looking for a more intentional growth of graduate programs (linked to a more balanced effort between growing undergrad enrollment and growing grad enrollment)
 - Looking to focus both on programs that cost us (Ph.D.s) and programs that generate revenue (professional Masters)
 - Excited about innovations like accelerated Masters degrees that feed more of our exceptional students into our own programs
- Update on Ph.D. students who might need to "Master out" (currently permissible; contact the Grad School).
